Meeting called to order by Tammy LoCascio at 5:00 PM

A motion was made to approve the agenda, seconded, and passed unanimously.

Tammy moved new business to the top of the agenda to provide an update on progress made by the Executive Search Committee in collaboration with BGCA. They are on track to meet the timeline set out with over 250 applicants' total.

Keith discussed the 2024 Board Calendar and all Board members agreed to maintain the same schedule. Keith presented a new board applicant, Eboni Ware-howze, from Coke Consolidated. A motion was made to accept her application; the motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

Gary, CFO – gave the financial report. He discussed funds for general operations, remaining grant funding to spend down from the City of Memphis grant, and loan payments being made.

Katie – gave the RD report and shared donor data, fundraising goals, special event committees, the RD plan, and upcoming grants

Gwendolyn – Gave the Operations report -- we are up to 5,764 Club members served and are trying to reach 6,000 by the end of the school year or sooner. She reviewed staff training, staff transitions, and several community partnerships that have led to in-kind donations and Club events. Partnerships include the NCAA, Grizzlies Foundation, Cadence Bank, GYAC, Amazon, SCS, University of Memphis, 901 Fund, and more.

James – Gave the Workforce Development report and spoke to the overall growth in our high school programs and strengthened relationships with school administrators. He discussed the partnership with KPMG and Manassas High School to carry out a three-part program centered on career exploration, resume building, and a workforce panel. Ruby Hancock invited board members to participate and expressed gratitude for the level of engagement from the students.

Keith – Gave the CEO report overviewing the success of the check presentation at Craigmont high school, the Family Dollar grant focusing on Westwood's youth advocacy project on mental health, and BGCA's Federal Grant audit.

Tammy LoCascio asked if there was any other business.
